For this first full year of activity, the Foundation can proudly boast highly positive results.

The commitments made on the creation of this bold, innovative organisation have been honoured: a clear focus on **'Action'** through support for concrete projects in keeping with our values and our **long-term corporate social responsibility policy**.

We are thus taking action, but not alone. Thanks to our shareholder foundation status, we possess sustainable financial resources, bolstered by cooperation with renowned experts and skill-based sponsorship. This approach has broadened the scope of our commitment, in close collaboration with academic talents, university hospitals, research centres, schools and private or public players.

We work as one to support projects that are consistent with the three key areas of our action, health, training and heritage:

Enhancing treatment for patients suffering from **neurodegenerative diseases**, and improving quality of life for caregiving families. While practices for dealing with these pathologies have improved vastly in recent years, particularly through highly-promising multi-disciplinary approaches, so much still remains to be done. Our Foundation has therefore chosen to make its action in this area a priority, through the sponsorship of 9 projects and support for the centre of excellence in neurodegenerative diseases at Bordeaux University Hospital.

Providing access to vocational training in **construction and civil works**, with individualised support. For this programme, rooted in our Group's DNA, the Foundation aims to assist young people who are attracted to our construction professions, but disadvantaged due to their background or difficulties in accessing high-quality training. We are currently funding 4 training grants.

Breathing new life into audacious historic built **heritage and promoting the know-how of building**, civil works and traditional craftsmanship. Our Foundation is currently lending its support to 3 initiatives which showcase the excellence professions of master-glassmakers, organ builders and fresco restorers.

The Foundation closed 2023 with a commitment of more than €1 million in these three areas, devoted to fourteen short, medium and long-term actions. This represents a substantial amount, and I would like to take this opportunity to praise the efforts of our teams and experts, who work tirelessly to identify needs, select projects and monitor their progress, while ensuring unfailing accountability for every euro invested.

Wherever you look there are numerous challenges to address. Through this philanthropic action, we are playing our part, on our level, but with steadfast determination.

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Action in keeping with the Fayat family and its values

Our Foundation is endowed with 5% of the Group's capital, and is the innovative embodiment of the spirit of social responsibility which has always driven the Fayat family. The guarantor of the Group's independence, our shareholder Foundation supports projects in keeping with our values: **autonomy, commitment and audacity**

Rising to the challenges of our society

All the Foundation's policies are guided by a clear focus on ACTION. For us, this means investing in concrete projects on a human scale, with a measurable, visible impact, enabling us to embark gradually on programmes of a broader scope.

Our action focuses on fighting for three causes. These are intrinsically linked to the history of the Fayat family, and aim to address societal challenges:

- *Fighting neurodegenerative **diseases**,*
- *Fostering **talent**,*
- *Bringing **heritage** to life.*

Health, education and heritage: three major causes to support

Fighting neurodegenerative diseases, by funding research and innovation prioritising the prevention of neurodegenerative diseases; by initiating or contributing to social projects related to these diseases.

Fostering talent, through training and education, by facilitating vocational integration projects in the building sector, or retraining projects from the building sector to another field, specifically in the interest of disadvantaged populations.

Bringing heritage to life, by contributing to the rehabilitation of historical buildings of local or national importance; by supporting heritage monument restoration projects.



The public interest guides our action

The Clément Fayat Foundation was recognised as a charity organisation in the public interest by decree on 13 January 2021, thus firmly rooting its patronage actions in the common good.

Commitments

By the end of 2023, the Foundation had committed a total exceeding €1 million for 14 projects.

14 projects supported in the form of research thesis grants, therapeutic education programmes, pilot research in complementary non-pharmacological interventions, research grants, training and vocational integration grants, and heritage restoration.

A more ambitious road map

Among the commitments exceeding 1 million by late 2023, new funding was granted during the year:

- > **€100,000** in the form of two grants for research in neurodegenerative diseases: the TAP-DLB (33) and IPPLAMS (33) projects
- > **€100,000** to two pilot projects for complementary non-pharmacological interventions: the MUSIC-HD (33) and VLHE (40) projects
- > **€117,000** for a 3rd research thesis grant: the VIP-PARK (33) project
- > **€51,856** directed to the funding of two therapeutic education programmes: ALOIS (33) and Vergers des Balans (24)
- > **€20,000** for the restoration of the Medieval frescoes of Saint-Calixte Church (65)
- > **€19,500** for the funding of two international vocational integration grants
- > **€300,000** in funding for the creation of a raised mobile console in the framework of reconstruction works on the pipe organs in Saint-André Cathedral, Bordeaux (33)

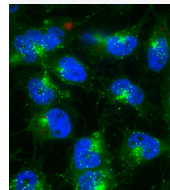

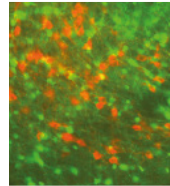

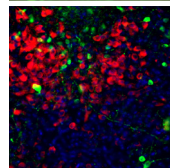

NAPAD: Development of nano-vectors for a lysosome-based therapeutic strategy in the fight against Parkinson's disease

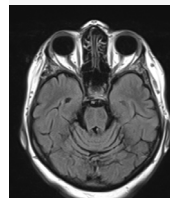


COUNTER-PD: Targeting the pedunculo-pontine nucleus to restore motor function in Parkinson's disease

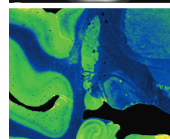

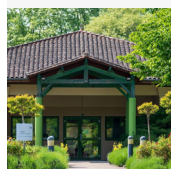

Of glass and angels

« These very special windows were an experimental project for René Lalique, due to their height and thickness (up to 4cm in places). Lalique never worked on this scale again. To maintain the works in their original location, we are creating transparent protective glazing featuring specific ironworks and load distribution systems. Installed outside, this will protect the Lalique bay windows from bad weather. We also need to fully recreate one stained-glass window because out of the 30 bay windows, one is missing. Fortunately we know exactly what design to recreate as the angels are set out symmetrically in the church. »

A new chapter for Bordeaux's cathedral

« Bordeaux cathedral now hosts 30 organ concerts a year. We want to organise more cultural events, and bring world-class organ festivals back to Bordeaux with unique repertoires and approaches to attract new audiences and young talents. However, given that the current organ loft is not up to the cathedral's acoustic potential, it would be better to build a new organ with a more powerful range and a raised console.

This console really adds something in visual, technical and musical terms, which opens up plenty of interpretative possibilities for the organist. »

« 2023 was the Foundation's first complete year of activity.

During the year, the Foundation received an interim dividend of €1,057,336 as a cash advance. The Foundation increased its resources slightly through investment income from the 2022 cash surplus.

This year was marked by increased commitments to the three focus areas and communication expenditure due notably to the creation of an in-house website. »

2023 in figures

Revenue: €1,068,984 broken down into:

- > **€1,057,336** in dividends
- > **€11,401** in financial income
- > **€235** in donations
- > **€12** in management products

Expenditure: €591,794
broken down into:

Project funding: €383,727

- > **Health: €219,227** in funding for 7 medical research actions
- > **Training: €29,500** for 4 vocational training and integration grants
- > **Heritage: €135,000** in funding for two restoration projects: the René Lalique windows and the pipe organs in Saint-André Cathedral, Bordeaux

Other expenditure:

- > Payroll, expenses and taxes: €169,564
- > Other operating expenses including communication: €38,503

2023 cash surplus: €477,190

Cash flow amounted to €1,067,209 on 31/12/2023.

This will be used in 2024 to offset the shift in dividend payments scheduled for April 2025.

Retained earnings for the year amount to €1,033,495.

The balance of commitments standing at €1,070,417 under agreements signed up to 2023 represents €509,691 divided between 2024, 2025 and 2026:

- > 2024 commitments: €320,691
- > 2025 commitments: €114,000
- > 2026 commitments: €75,000



A word from **Axelle Pinseau** Director of the Clément Fayat Foundation

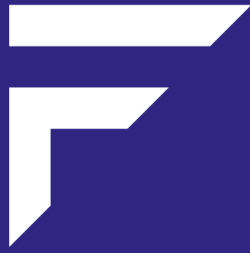


« Following an initial year devoted to organising our governance and launching the first support actions, specifically in the fields of neurodegenerative disease research and heritage, 2023 came to a close with ongoing funding for 14 projects and the setting-up of digital communication tools. The newly-created internet website and LinkedIn page, in addition to the introductory article in Fayat Way and monthly publications in Fayat News informed Fayat Group employees of their Foundation's activities.

Our aim for 2024 is to further promote the Clément Fayat Foundation both within and outside of the Group.

We plan to create 'My Date with the Foundation', an event for the Group's employees. This event will provide an opportunity for project owners to present their work and achievements. We also hope to produce an introductory film on the Clément Fayat Foundation.
